Enhancements to *Early On*Referral Form





Request From Physicians

- In collaboration with the MIAAP, the University of Michigan YPL, MiLEAP, and the MDE, OSE
- Elimination of the back-and-forth
- Enhancement to the referral form



Referral Intake Form Addition

- Necessary information for determining eligibility
- "Health Status Report" section
- Physician-initiated referrals only

Health Status Report

When compared to a typically developing, same-aged peers, do any of the child's above diagnoses (including all physical, mental, and behavioral health disorders) have:

Potential to impact their capacity for physical exertion and/or the ability to resist force?

(e.g. does the child need more assistance with mobility and/or physical transitions than would be expected?)

Potential to impact their ability to fully participate in daily routines due to decreased endurance, reduced energy, or inability to sustain effort?



Hearing Screening/Test

- If the child has had a Hearing Screening/Test and a Vision Screening/Test, a drop down section will appear, prompting the physician to input the date of the screening/test as well as the results.
- To determine eligibility:
 - A recent vision and hearing report from a physician can be used -
 - Within three months if the child is younger than 18 months;
 - Within six months if older;
 - If the child is younger than three months of age, the newborn hearing screening result may be used.



Memo From MilEAP

- Communication serves as confirmation
- Applies to physician referrals only
- All other referrals will still need Health Status Request Form completed

SUBJECT: Health Status Report

In collaboration with the Michigan Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the University of Michigan Youth Policy Lab, we are excited to announce an enhancement to the referral process for physicians.

To further streamline this process, we have updated the Early On referral intake form by adding questions that better capture the information necessary for determining eligibility.

Previously, Early On personnel would have to send a Health Status Request to physicians to complete and return after the local Early On office received their referral. To eliminate the need for this back-and-forth, we have integrated a new "Health Status Report" section directly into the referral form for physician-initiated referrals. See below:



What Early Data Shows

- Of 559 Physician Referrals, 223
 (40%) have the Health Status Report section completed
- More physician training is needed
